Welcome to our Autumn edition of GPCF newsletter.

This term we have been busy working on a number of areas which have been included in this newsletter.

S1-S3 parents have been attending a "Beyond the Broad General Education" conference, organised by Glasgow City Council with Scottish Government funding issued to Local Authorities to promote parent based activities, to enhance our understanding of the new qualifications. GCC decided, in consultation with GPCF, to hold a city wide secondary school event with additional learning materials to follow for schools and parent councils.

This year's National Parent Forum of Scotland conference saw a large turnout of Glasgow parents to hear Sir Ian Wood's keynote speech.

Sir Ian delivered his understanding of what the report "Developing Scotland's Young workforce" is proposing and he gave his own thoughts to why it is important for young people of all abilities to look at which career path is best for them. Sir Ian reinforced how important parents are moving forward with the recommendations of the commission.

The Scottish Government have announced the **budget** for the next two years in Scotland. As parents, we know that funding will be tighter than ever this year and the GPCF will arrange a special meeting in January 2015 to hear what the GCC education budget may be. Details to follow...

School Meals consultation

GCC has issued a consultation regarding school meals. Headed "Food Policy for Glasgow's schools" the consultation will look at improving the health of our young people at school.

Please ensure that your Parent Council have discussed this draft proposal during your parent council meetings as it is vital that parents' views are heard. There is a survey to which Parent Councils and parents can respond with their views. All schools, parent councils and Cordia catering managers are being consulted on this draft policy. Your views will shape the final policy direction which will go to the City Council executive committee for agreement.

This consultation will be discussed at the GPCF meeting in November, prior to our own submission, to ensure we are representing the views of a wide range of parents.

The Scottish Government has committed to the introduction of free school meals to all P1-P3 children starting January 2015. Parent Councils may have been involved in discussions with their Head Teacher and Cordia regarding the changes which will be made to accommodate the increased demand on places at lunch time. If you have not discussed this at your parent council meeting or wish more information you Head Teacher will be happy to advise you on the changes.
